Celebrating the Catholic traditions of Mardi Gras

Mardi Gras is French for 'Fat Tuesday', also called Shrove Tuesday. It is the day before Ash Wednesday, which marks the start of the Christian Lent season leading up to Easter. During Lent, many Catholics fast, and the name Fat Tuesday refers to the last day of eating richer foods before the leaner days of Lent begin.

Many families within our school community would celebrate Shrove Tuesday as part of their cultural traditions and so we wanted to bring a carnival vibe to St Mary's on Shrove Tuesday so that our children can experience the joyful traditions celebrated around the world by many.

To celebrate Shrove Tuesday, we are planning a day of celebration, making wonderful links within and across all curriculum areas. Children will be recapping and applying key knowledge and skills from the Advent Term within this rich theme. For example, our pupils will be using their key knowledge from geography to locate places around the world where Mardi Gras is celebrated, KS2 pupils will apply their DT knowledge by designing and making a float, others will be creating and comparing their art using painting techniques and computer-generated animations using the Mardi Gras signs and symbols as a stimulus, to name a few ideas.

We will of course mark our own cultural traditions, Mr Johnson and the Catering Team have agreed to serve pancakes as part of the lunch menu on that day with a range of toppings for the children's enjoyment.

As Shrove Tuesday falls on the children's first day back after the February half term we thought they might like to make a mask over half term. A separate document will be shared to inspire the children's imagination using the liturgical colours of purple, green and gold which represent justice, faith and power (please see attached PDF). We are also happy for the children to accessories their school uniform using the traditional colours with purple, green or gold hair clips, ribbons, and socks for example.







Mardi Gras has developed and evolved as it has travelled around the world, therefore if you and child choose to research beforehand, please use the following search 'Traditional Catholic Mardi Gras'. Staff will be prepared to discuss how this catholic tradition has evolved, albeit at an age-appropriate level and as it states above have plans to link the activities to all areas of the curriculum.

World Book Day

We will be celebrating World Book day on Friday 4th March. We have not been able to celebrate this properly for a couple of years so we are super excited about being all back together this year to do so. This is a great day to celebrate our love of reading and all things books! We would love to see the children (and staff!) dress up as their favourite book character and Miss Drayton will be giving out prizes to the best and most inventive characters!

Each class in school will also be looking at the same book 'The Sea Saw' by Tom Percival and creating lots of exciting things from reading this beautiful story — we will showcase our work on Twitter and Class Dojo for you to see and also be celebrating our work within our learning spaces in school. We would also love to do a book swap shop. We did this back in 2018 and it was a great success! If you have any children's books you no longer want or have finished with, please send them in on the day and each phase will create a swap shop in their learning spaces so all children can receive a new book. We will also be distributing the World Book day vouchers so children can purchase their own new book from participating shops. Thank you for all you are doing with reading at home — keep it up!

City Road Parking
