Dear Parents and Carers

A warm welcome back to the new academic year, especially to our new families. The children have settled really well into their new classes and Phases. It was lovely to see so many smiling faces from children, staff and parents and carers. Thank you for providing your child/ren with the appropriate school uniform – they look so smart!

Equally Safe Programme

This year we are working with EqualiTeach (www.equaliteach.co.uk) as part of their Equally Safe Programme which has been funded by the Department for Education and has been designed to support schools to take a whole school approach to preventing and tackling bullying, with a specific focus on identity-based bullying. The programme will help us to:

- Ensure that our policies and procedures are robust and actively support anti-bullying work
- > Have an increased understanding of how to promote equality, diversity and inclusion throughout the school curriculum and environment
- > Increase confidence amongst staff and pupils in reporting prejudice-related incidents and identity-based bullying
- > Increase pupil voice and pupils who are empowered to support their peers and develop their own anti-bullying initiatives
- Reduce incidents of bullying amongst staff and pupils
- Increase compliance with our duties under the Equality Act 2010, Education and Inspections Act 2006, Education Act 2002 and requirements for Ofsted.

We first shared the above with you last May as we believe our parents and carers play an important role of our school community. Thank you to the few parents who completed a short survey sent out in the Pentecost term. However, in order for the school to gauge a fuller understanding, we would like to extend the offer for all parents and carers the opportunity to have their opinions heard via a short questionnaire. The results of this will inform our action plans moving forward this academic year. Mrs Novak-Lemmings is due to meet a representative from Equaliteach to work on our school's next steps to ensure the children feel part of an equal, diverse and inclusive community. End of the Day Safeguarding

If you collect your child from school at the end of the day, and would like to speak to your child's class teacher, we ask that you wait by the green sheds until the teachers have dismissed <u>all</u> pupils in their class. Please do not approach the class teachers; they will release all children into their parent's care before speaking to any parent or carer. Sometimes, your child's class teacher may wish to speak to you and will ask you to wait. If parents or carers are unable to wait, the class teacher will then make a phone call home having given families time to make it home.

Homework

For the month of September, the homework focus will be solely on reading and times-tables (number bonds for the children in FS). Can we ask our families to ensure their child/ren read at least 4 times a week and record this on their child's ClassDojo. Each time they read at home will earn them a Dojo point.

As well as regular reading, we ask parents to encourage their child/ren to learn the times-tables facts appropriate for their year group's curriculum. Please note, by the end of Year 4, the children are expected to know and recall fluently all the times tables up to 12x.

Having reviewed the homework policy last year which included staff and parental input, we will be introducing new English and Maths workbooks towards the end of this half term. More information around this will follow in due course.

In our bid to ensure fewer items end up in lost property, please ensure all uniform is labelled with your child's name. Book bags are available to purchase through the school office if needed. Lunch boxes/bags should be used for packed lunches which are placed in the cupboards just outside your child's classroom.
