Archaeologist	A person who studies history by digging up objects to tell us about its past.
Aqueduct	A structure, like a bridge, which carries water.
Continent	A large solid area of land. Earth has seven continents.
Empire	A group of countries that are controlled by one ruler.
Government	A group of people who control and make decisions for a country.
Hillfort	An area or settlement built on high ground and enclosed within a wall.
Imported	Goods brought from one country into another, e.g. olive oil was imported by the Romans.
Kingdom	An area of land ruled by a King or Queen.
Latin	The language of Ancient Rome.
Mosaic	A picture made of tiny tiles. The Romans used it in their villas.
Roman Governor	A person that was in charge of an area of the Roman Empire.
Settlement	A place where people live. Settlements can be small - just a few huts - or large. Some settlements are permanent or temporary.
Taxes	Money people pay to the government.
