


## Subject Specific Vocabulary

| Word(s)               | Definition  |
|-----------------------|---|
| <b>Magi</b>           | Wise men from the East. Also known as The Three Kings.  |
| <b>Adoration</b>      | The Magi adore Jesus. They bow down before him.   |
| <b>Epiphany</b>       | The day that celebrates the revealing of God in His Son as human in Jesus Christ.   |
| <b>Kingdom of God</b> | The place where God reigns as King.   |
| <b>Miracle</b>        | An unusual or wonderful event that is believed to be caused by the power of God.  |
| <b>Parable</b>        | A short and simple story told by Jesus to teach people about the Kingdom of God.  |
| <b>Bible</b>          | A collection of books that are the inspired word of God.  |
| <b>Saint</b>          | Someone who has proven himself or herself to be holy by following God's teachings, and has entered the Kingdom of Heaven. |
| <b>Oscar Romero</b>   | Oscar Romero, recognised as a saint in 2018, was a Catholic priest who was Archbishop of San Salvador from 1977-1980.     |



The Kingdom of Heaven is populated by souls who devote themselves to doing the will of God.

Pope Francis approved a miracle which was attributed to Oscar Romero. His canonisation took place on 14 October 2018 in Rome.
