Work to transform St James' House, off Mansfield Road in Derby, has been completed and they will move in on Monday. Since the arson attack on the school's Broadway site on October 3, 2020 staff and pupils have been split across two sites. Parents will be able to access a free bus service which will pick up and drop off from three locations around the city to reduce the number of cars driving into the area. It is anticipated that St Mary's, which is part of the St Ralph Sherwin Catholic Multi Academy Trust, will be based at St James' House for two years.</p> <p>Amanda Greaves, executive head at St Mary's, said: "We cannot wait to welcome the whole community back together. "I'm delighted with St James' and staff have done an incredible job in preparing the learning spaces for children. "We appreciate pupils, staff and parents have endured many changes over the past year but we are extremely thankful for the support we continue to receive from the school, trust, our family of schools and parishes and wider community and look forward to this next exciting phase."</p> <p>Following the fire, pupils in years three, four, five and six were based at St Benedict Catholic Academy in Duffield Road.
