

Elephants need to be kept clean or they can often become unhealthy. Use this handy set of instructions to ensure you keep your pet squeaky clean.</p> <p><b>Equipment*</b></p> <p>an<sup>2</sup> extra long hosepipe (at least 10 metres)<sup>1</sup> a<sup>2</sup> pair of elephant nail clippers a<sup>2</sup> set of step ladders a<sup>2</sup> sheet of sand paper a<sup>2</sup> long sweeping brush with stiff bristles a<sup>2</sup> feather duster a<sup>2</sup> bottle of elephant shampoo</p> <p><b>Method*</b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Firstly<sup>1</sup>, prepare your elephant for their bathing session in an<sup>1</sup> area with plenty of space. Make sure that your animal<sup>2</sup> is calm, well-fed and content. It may help to tickle their<sup>2</sup> tummies to relax them<sup>2</sup> if<sup>2</sup> they<sup>2</sup> are nervous about getting wet<sup>1</sup>.</li> <li>Next<sup>1</sup>, prop up the step ladders beside<sup>1</sup> your pet<sup>2</sup> otherwise<sup>1</sup> it is impossible<sup>2</sup> to reach the top of their body. Climb the ladders carefully<sup>2</sup> as<sup>2</sup> you carry the hosepipe<sup>2</sup>. Use lukewarm water to completely<sup>2</sup> soak your elephant's skin.</li> <li>After that<sup>1</sup>, squeeze a whole<sup>2</sup> bottle of elephant shampoo onto<sup>2</sup> the animal's<sup>2</sup> back. Use the sweeping brush to reach up and scrub every part of their<sup>2</sup> dirty skin. Start at their<sup>2</sup> back and work downwards<sup>2</sup> to their<sup>2</sup> feet.</li> <li>Afterwards<sup>1</sup>, rinse them<sup>2</sup> off until<sup>2</sup> all of the soap suds are gone. Be very careful<sup>2</sup> not to let any of the shampoo drip into<sup>2</sup> your pet<sup>2</sup>'s eyes as<sup>2</sup> the pain<sup>2</sup> could cause them<sup>2</sup> to suddenly<sup>2</sup> charge at<sup>2</sup> you<sup>1</sup>.</li> <li>Now<sup>1</sup>, you need to make your elephant lie down. A<sup>2</sup> tasty bun may be helpful<sup>2</sup> to convince them<sup>2</sup> to go down to<sup>2</sup> the ground. Use the sand paper to file the dead skin from<sup>2</sup> the bottom of their<sup>2</sup> feet and the nail clippers to trim their<sup>2</sup> toenails. As a result<sup>2</sup>, you should watch out for sharp bits of flying elephant toenail!</li> <li>Finally<sup>1</sup>, you need to gently<sup>2</sup> clean your elephant's nostrils and ears using the feather duster. This can be very dangerous<sup>2</sup>. Move quickly<sup>2</sup> away from<sup>2</sup> your elephant's trunk if<sup>2</sup> they<sup>2</sup> begin to shake or start to breathe<sup>2</sup> more heavily<sup>2</sup>.
