



Technical knowledge and Vocabulary

L.S. Lowry - A British painter famous for his industrial landscapes and scenes of working-class life, often characterised by his distinctive use of simplified forms, figures, and limited colours. He is best known for his urban landscapes with human figures often referred to as 'matchstick men'. He mostly painted using five colours only.

Sketch - A quick, rough drawing used to capture an idea or concept.

Line - A mark made by a pencil, pen, or other tool on a surface, which can vary in thickness, texture, and direction.

Landscape - a well-known type of art that often shows a scene from nature, such as the countryside. The term landscape painting was developed in the 17th Century. Some landscape paintings include buildings or scenes from a city. These are known as cityscapes.

Perspective - The way in which objects appear to the eye in terms of their relative position, distance and size.
